Introduction to Apologetics

OVERVIEW

Apologetics comes from the Greek word *apologia* and is more literally translated "defense." Apologetics is an important part of the Christian faith, because we have a responsibility to "go therefore, make disciples" (Matt. 28:19-20), to be "ministers of reconciliation" (2 Cor. 5:19), and to "hold fast to the trustworthy message" (Tit. 1:9). Our responsibility as Christians is to know why we believe what we believe and be able to explain it to those who do not understand. This does not mean we will know everything about everything. God is infinite and outside of our full human comprehension, which brings in the reality of faith. However, God reveals things to us through logic, science, history, Creation, etc. so we can be confident in Him and share that with others.

 - Ex. Historicity of Jesus, Reliability of the New Testament, Intelligent Design
- 2. Negative Apologetics
 - Deconstruct an opposing worldview or defend an attack on Christianity
 - Defensive Approach
 - Ex. Logical inconsistency in another religion, defend a criticism of the Biblical text

 - 3. Share Truth
