Old Testament: Genesis – Judges

OVERVIEW

The Old Testament is a collection of books written over the course of hundreds of years, by multiple authors, at different times, in different locations communicating the same message of God. We see God begin to reveal Himself throughout the **Torah** as He creates, His creation chooses to worship themselves, He begins a plan to restore His creation to its original design through the Abraham and the nation of Israel. The Torah is the first five books of the Old Testament, Joshua and Judges continue this genealogical movement of the nation of Israel. These books are considered **historical narrative**, meaning these books tell history in a narrative form.

2. Joshua

- Joshua leads people into the Promised Land (Joshua 1:1)
- Joshua conquers surrounding nations (Joshua 24:17-18)
- People of Israel worshipped God (Joshua 24:31)
- God **PRESERVES** His people through war (battle of Jericho)

3. Judges

- After Joshua dies, the nation of Israel conquers the Canaanites
- People of Israel turned from God (Judges 2:12)
- God gave the nation Judges to **PRESERVE** the nation of Israel (Judges 2:16)
