The New Testament

OVERVIEW

As many of you will remember, the Jewish people split into two Kingdoms around 930 B.C. (Israel in the North and Judah in the South). Israel, because of so many bad kings, fell first in 722 B.C. Judah, because they were unwilling to repent and turn to God, fell in 586 B.C. You should remember all the prophets who came to warn the Israelites this would happen. After the Jewish people were scattered by the Assyrians and Babylonians, they were allowed to return to rebuild the Temple (516 B.C.) and city of Jerusalem by King Cyrus, the Persian king. After the last writing by Malachi, there would be a "400-year silence" from God as God prepares to bring Jesus into the world. This does not mean God was not working, rather He did not send any new prophets and He did not reveal anything new to the Jewish people.
