Sermon Series: Why Do We Do That?

Sermon Title: Why Do We Preach and Team from the Bible?

Sermon Date: 9-22-19

Gospel Gain: We preach and team from the Bible because it is the inspired and inerrant Word of God.

Gathering Together (Icebreaker)

When and where do you remember first reading the Bible or hearing it read?

What do you appreciate about the Bible?

Do you think the Bible is more respected or more attacked in our culture and why?

Growing Together (Truth/Equipping)

In this study we will see the value of God's Word, the Bible. We will see that the Bible was inspired by God as He communicated His will through various writers and settings to create these Holy Scriptures. We will see that the Bible is alive and still valuable to our daily walk with Jesus.

Read: 2 Timothy 3:16-17

What gets your attention when read this scripture passage and why?

What do you think it means when it says – *All Scripture is breathed out by God?*

How would you define the "inspiration" of Scripture?

Why is the inspiration of God's Word a big deal?

Why would the historical reliability of Scripture be important to Christian living today?

How would you define the "inerrancy" of Scripture?

If you thought there were some small errors in Scripture, how do you think that would affect the way you read Scripture?

Does belief in inerrancy guarantee sound doctrine and a sound Christian life? Why or why not?

Why is the inerrancy of Scripture so important?

Read: *Proverbs 30:5-6*

How does this passage speak to the topic of the inerrancy of Scripture?

Read: *2 Timothy 3:16-17*

In what ways, according to this passage, is Scripture profitable for Christians?

How can God's Word be useful for building sound doctrine in your life?

Scripture is helpful for personal and doctrinal reproof, like discerning false teachings. Why would this be important to Christian living?

Scripture is helpful for correction and restoration. How does having a solid base of Biblical authority impact the process of personal or relational correction and restoration?

Scripture is helpful for moral training that leads to righteous living. How can Scripture be a valuable standard for guiding our day to day life?

How would you describe "righteous living"? How would the Bible describe "righteous living"?

Read: *Hebrews 4:12*

What does this passage say about the value of Scripture to our daily life as a Christian?

Getting Real with One Another (Accessibility)

What is one truth about Scripture that helps you follow Jesus day by day?

What has been helpful to you when it comes to spending regular time reading God's Word?

How can this Life Group elevate the importance of God's Word in our life, our church and today's culture?

Group Prayer Time (Supplication)

Share some prayer requests with one another and then pray for one another.
