#### The Heart of Worship

#### Gospel Gain:

Extended hands are one of the ways in which we can revere and praise (yadah) God.

# **Gathering Together (Icebreaker)**

Some people are more reserved in a worship service while others have grown up in a more expressive church worship culture. What type of worship culture did you experience as a child if you attended church at all? What were the pro's and con's of those experiences?

# **Growing Together (Truth/Equipping)**

The word *praise* is used often in the Old Testament. However, the word *praise* has various meanings when it is used. The first meaning we will learn about is yadah.

**Yadah** (yaw-daw): To revere or worship with extended hands. To hold out the hands. To throw a stone or arrow.

Read the following passages where yadah was used to describe praise...

- Psalm 143:6
- Lamentations 3:41
- 1 Kings 8:22

Based on these verses, how common do you think the practice of lifting hands in worship was in the ancient world?

If you have ever raised your hands in worship to praise God, share with the group what that experience was like for you. What fears come to mind when it comes to the idea of being more expressive in a worship service? What are some of the potential barriers from being more expressive in a worship service?
